### **Summer Programming**

In July, I ran 21 programs with a total of 205 participants. Libraries were able to choose from six program options. The three most popular choices were Ozobots, Roarsome Dinosaur Dig, and Hanging Solar Systems. To date, I have had 350 participants and I still have eight more programs to go.

Teens participating in the Teen Summer Reading Challenge have read a collective 147 books this summer - we still have more than a week to go! That is an average of 18 books per week!

Staff have also enjoyed some summer programming here at HQ. They have played bingo, searched for treasure, and walked the plank.

The Ozobot program filled up quickly in Chestermere! Kids used different coloured pens and patterns to make their robots move in various ways.

#### **New Kits & Games**

Marigold has added five new kits to the Kits & Games Collection! Requesting a kit is easy, just fill out the <u>Kits & Games Booking Request form</u>.

We've also revamped the <u>Kits & Games webpage</u>! You'll now find a list of the entire collection including pictures, descriptions, and even links to programming resources and ideas.

#### **Binocular Kit**



This kit includes five binoculars with cases and stands, two Alberta Invasive Plant Identification Guides, a set of notebooks, and three copies of each Alberta Nature Booklet: "Trees & Wildflowers", "Birds", and "Wildlife." This kit is great for bird watching, outdoor education, species identification, and more!

Also included is a pamphlet of common Alberta plant names in the Blackfoot language. For Blackfoot names of more plants, check out the <u>Nitsitapiisini Plant Index</u>. For Blackfoot wildlife names, check out these <u>Galt Museum</u> and <u>Helen Schuler Nature</u> <u>Centre</u> resources. Resources in the Nakoda language will be included as well once completed.

#### Microscope Kit

This kit contains 16 handheld microscopes and 60 prepared slides. Use the provided slides, or have participants find their own specimens to observe. The microscopes are portable and battery powered, making them flexible for indoor and outdoor programming. This kit is perfect for programming for all ages!



#### **Mobile Podcast and Photo Booth**



This kit contains a pop-up greenscreen, ring light, and four microphones that connect directly to your phone, tablet, or computer. Use it to record audio or video, take marketing photos, set up a themed photo booth, record oral histories, make Tik Toks, and more! The kit also includes

easy instructions to get you started right out of the box.

#### **Animation Kit**

Explore a new hobby with this Animation Kit! It includes five light up tracing boards, sketch pencils, tracing paper, artist gloves, and a set of animation guide books.




#### Werewolf



# TD Summer Reading Club 2024 CELA Accessibility Award

Tell us how you made your TD Summer Reading Club program welcoming to kids with disabilities by applying for the 2024 **CELA Accessibility Award**!

The award criteria are based on how libraries took an inclusive approach to their programs by featuring alternate format books, as well as integrating accessibility into programming, staff training and community outreach.

#### Who is eligible to apply for the award?

To apply, you must be a public library (or a public library branch) that

- participated in the TD Summer Reading Club during the year of application
- offered the TD Summer Reading Club program for at least six weeks that summer
- completed the TD Summer Reading Club Statistics and Evaluation Form before
   September 30 using the link that will be provided when the survey is sent out
- clearly identified the TD Summer Reading Club in all promotional and programming materials, as outlined in the detailed <u>brand guidelines</u>
- is prepared to promote your TD Summer Reading Club program and share your strategies

Winners will not be eligible for prizes the following year. Participating libraries may submit one application per year.

Applications may be submitted in English or French. Libraries may apply for both the <u>Library Awards</u> and the CELA Accessibility Award.

#### How to apply

Complete the TD Summer Reading Club Accessibility Award <u>Application form</u> by **September 23, 2024**.

**Optional:** send supporting documentation to <a href="mailto:members@celalibrary.ca">members@celalibrary.ca</a>. This could include videos, photographs, letters, statistics, news articles, website pages, newsletters, promotional materials or other appropriate materials that effectively describe your program.



#### **Evaluation criteria for the CELA Accessibility Award**

Applicants will be evaluated according to all the following criteria. Please describe how you made accessibility a priority at your library by addressing these points:

- 1. Created inclusion in your Club by making your spaces, programming, communications and other activities accessible.
- 2. Made staff, volunteers and summer students aware of accessible resources to offer equitable library services.
- 3. Promoted and gave children access to accessible materials (e.g., audiobooks, e-books, braille) of various genres, formats and reading levels that were geared to their interests, abilities and experiences.
- 4. Developed innovative outreach strategies to include the disabled community and engaged with various groups of children or community groups (Learning Disability Associations, CNIB, etc.) in your targeted age groups.


#### **Novelist**
