Librarians and educators are often called upon to serve a young reader going through a crisis—whether it's family separation, divorce, death, or natural curiosity and confusion about race, sex, gender, and religion. It can be daunting to know what to say in the moment, how much to say, and how to preserve the child's privacy without undermining parents and family. This art-based workshop offers practical strategies for engaging and supporting a child in their own exploration of a tough topic or experience from a place of integrity, compassion, and with healthy boundaries.

In a time of book bans and direct threats to librarians and libraries, responding appropriately to children's curiosity or personal disclosures is a big responsibility. This session offers participants a chance to reflect on forbidden information—whether it's about us or someone else—by drawing

out relevant childhood experiences from our own lives. Using collage alongside directed conversation, the session will help cut through the politicized din and reconnect participants to their instincts when it comes to being a first responder and trusted facilitator of knowledge.

After participating in this workshop, learners will be able to:

- Respond to a child in need with appropriateness, confidence, and compassion.
- Use collage and artmaking to create opportunities for the child to explore their questions guided by their own observations and lived experience.
- Be grounded in their own childhood sense of what worked and didn't when they needed support from an adult for coping with tough topics (presence, listening, regard for the questioner regardless of the questions or their answers).
- Access a new network of peers with whom they shared this training and from whom they can seek advice in the future.

A working knowledge of copyright is crucial for modern library staff. As librarians, our work increasingly encompasses copyright-intensive programs and projects. In the age of AI, we are confronted with crucial questions about topics like digitization, public domain, fair use, e-media, scholarly publishing, streaming, and more.

Copyright Essentials for Libraries, Archives, and Cultural Institutions trains learners in an immersive-style program emphasizing practical copyright law. The course empowers learners with a grounding in well-established library law and policy that will help reduce copyright risk at their institutions and serve to create an informed, empowered community for the library and their patrons.

With these challenges, libraries and cultural institutions also have an opportunity to harness the powers given to staff through the federal copyright statute. Under the law, libraries represent the carefully crafted balance in copyright: serving both the "economic" and "access" purposes of copyright. Libraries are, therefore, a part of the economic engine that

underlies copyright law's creator rights through purchase of materials while also satisfying copyright's Constitutional purpose in "promoting the Progress of Science and the Useful Arts" through knowledge distribution.

# Work It Out @ Your Library With the Wombats

This webinar will introduce you to <u>Work It Out @ Your Library!</u> a new program for families in your community, built around <u>Work it Out Wombats!</u>, a national PBS KIDS television series for 4- to 6-year-olds. Through hands-on activities, library storytime sessions, animated videos, and a family app, this flexible program helps library staff guide families through the exploration of computational thinking.

Computational thinking is a creative way of solving problems in more organized ways. When children make believe they're running a restaurant, they explore *sequencing* by figuring out the steps for serving a customer a meal. When they play with blocks to make a castle, they can practice the *design* process by creating, testing, and improving the structure. Library staff are uniquely suited to promote this learning with their library families.

The webinar will cover why computational thinking skills are important for young children, how the free resources have been used to run fun and engaging programs in libraries, and how you can, too.

Lombardozzi has spent the last six years on the project and will share insights into the cross-discipline experience of working closely with both library staff and design and construction teams and provide tips and tools on how to make this type of communication effective.

This presentation is geared towards anyone with an upcoming improvements project, but the project management strategies presented can be applied to a wide range of ventures not limited to construction. Those that have worked on design/construction enterprises before will find innovative ideas for successful project implementation and those that are new to this practice will learn the groundwork for efficiently advancing projects.

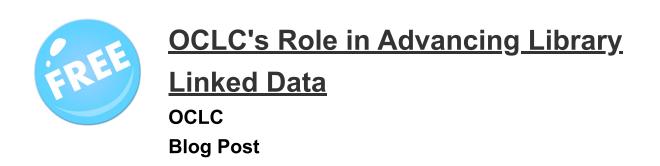
